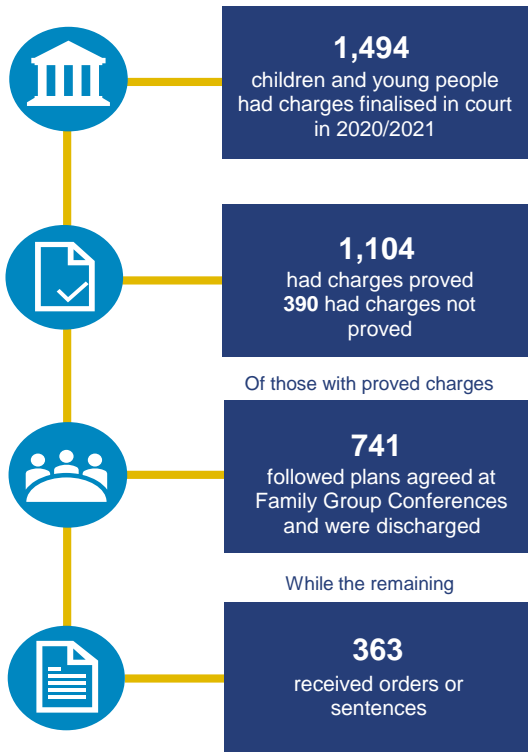




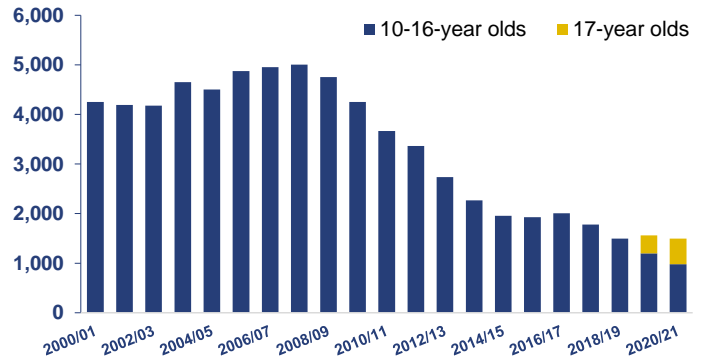
Trends in children and young people in court

Statistics for children (aged 10-13) and young people (aged 14-17*) in the Youth, District and High Courts in the year ended June 2021

Most offending by children and young people is dealt with outside the court system, only the most serious offending goes to court



1,494 children and young people were in court in 2020/2021, including **516** 17-year olds



In 2020/2021 the most serious offences differed for:

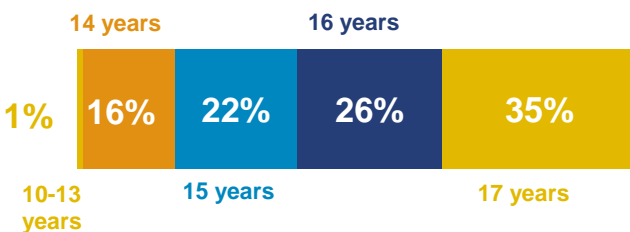
10-16-year olds



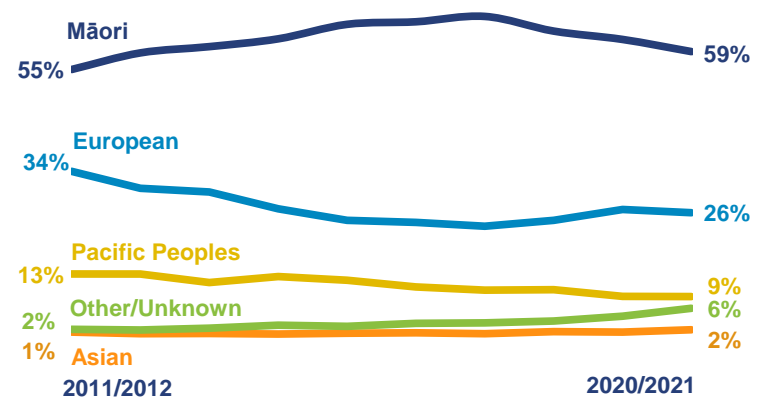
17-year olds
